Cindy or Justin and I would pack a treat bag – we tried to put in at least 10g of protein, some fruit, crackers and treats, along with something to drink and hand wipes. Most important of

Now our church is doing them to hand out. You'd be amazed at how happy the people I see often are to have something to "give back" by taking our prayer request. In fact recently by our supermarket I stopped to talk to Robinson, who loves our blessing bags. The first thing he did was tear open the package. I thought he was looking for a drink or snack. Instead he immediately said, "Hey! I ain't get no prayer?" So, just be aware. Robinson may be out there in this heat praying for you!



As I shared with you last month, Cindy is really coming into a new phase of her own ministry. I love her playing guitar with me and preaching at our church. "This week I discovered that a song I grew up singing in church and loving dearly was written by a lesbian. Marsha Stevens-Pino wrote that song in 1969 and it was very popular in the Jesus People movement where I arew up. But she came out as a lesbian in 1981 and lost all opportunity to continue sharing her music in the evangelical community after that. It is so meaningful to me to realize now that a song that was comforting to me, a closeted queer kid who was taught to hate myself. was written by a queer woman. There are queer folks that will be served by your song now in the same way. You have given the Church a gift. Thank you."

"We have not met irl, but I always loved your music. I was involved in Christian/gospel music from very young. The late Audrey Meier and Andre Crouch were mentors. I admire you dedication to live your truth and your ministry."

"I hope you are well and feel the joy and peace of God today. I want to offer an encouragement to you. I have recently begun dating a guy, and we have talked a little about faith and music. He isn't religious, though he has a catholic background. I was telling him a little about gay Christians in recent history and mentioned you and For Those tears. He later told me he went on his own and listened to Children of the Day's version of the song and really liked it. I found it pretty cool that a non religious guy would appreciate such a gospel-filled song and I hope it encourages you, too. God is working through you and all the songs you do, from the first song to the most recent."

"Years ago I searched for FTTID – I first heard it in the 70s and always loved it. What a treasure to find this morning, you singing your amazing song. The song has touched more lives than you will ever know."
