I'm incredibly happy to start some traveling again this week. In the meantime, things have been moving along in Nashville.

To start with, Cindy did not go to Cambodia and VietNam. The trip was canceled due to the new coronavirus. She is now already packed to go to South Africa in June. (I would SO love to go and see you friends of mine there.) Since Cindy was here, she reached out to Justin Lee for some copies of his book, Talking Across the Divide and some input for getting together with some of the people at our own church who (strongly) disagree with us about the full participation of LGBTQ+ folks in the life and ministry of the United Methodist Church (UMC). After reading his book, she talked with Justin for quite a while, then scheduled a meeting with the leaders of that group. The good news was that the couple who lead that group, did agree to meet with her.

In the meantime, I went to the Reconciling Ministries Network (RMN) conference at another local UMC where the congregation is reconciling. (I have to say, as much as I love the movement of so many main line Christian denominations to include the LGBTQ+ community, I get confused with all the euphemisms for "we like queers at this church;" reconciling, open and affirming, more light, etc.) Cindy's meeting with the non-affirming group was happening the first night, so there were a LOT of people praying for that meeting. When I told one of the women who leads the RMN for our area where Cindy was, she said, "of COURSE she is. Where else

would she be?" It was one of those "didn't you know I would be about my Father's business" moments.

The more difficult thing was how many people said, "Why are you going to Brentwood United Methodist? Why don't you just go to another church?" After 36 years in MCC, it feels weird to be so far back along that path. But of course, we are exactly where Jesus has called us to be, and thanking God for all the experience that Troy Perry and Nancy Wilson led us through. It's coming in handy here.

The rest of the conference was made more wonderful by the fact that Cindy was with me. There was a lot of politics. I do not like being called progressive or liberal or calling other people conservative or fundamentalists, even though one group of people does consider themselves "Bible literalists," which I find completely ridiculous. Even if we "limit" it to the New Testament, I have yet to see even one of them walking around without their right eye or their right hand, so I'm pretty sure that "literal" is tempered by some creative self-preservation. Anyway, there was an awful lot of politics – who is voting for what on which committee and so on. But the services were wonderful. At one of them, the pastor doing the Scripture reading said, "The word of God today is among us, so I will call you out and you give me the verse that comes to your mind." Then she went around pointing to people and everyone, right on the spur of the moment, came up with a wonderful favorite. It really made the Word feel "living."

At the final service, the first out gay (lesbian) bishop in the UMC, Karen Oliveto, preached the roof off. After a lot of stories of what people have been through and put one another through, she said, "And when someone says things like that to me, I smile and thank them for their honesty, then I get in my car and scream as loud as I can, and I have this ready to play at full volume." Then she started Shake it Off. I know secular music doesn't speak to everyone, but it was such a perfect ending to all the tension of the weekend.

SO, I'm back on the road on Thursday to see family and sing in Portland at the Gresham United Methodist Church. And then off to the other side of the country for a good time with some UCC church friends in Lake Worth Florida. Come say hi!!
