What You Have to Say (or in this case, what I had to say when you wrote to me)

"I'm so sorry you're going through this kind of pain. I totally have the "been there done that's" as you know. I think the scariest thing is to realize you are actually going to have to go back to the Bible and to prayer and find out what YOU believe. I don't know, of course, what exactly your questions are about why God would NOT be okay with you.

The other thing I would say is to remember that when you read the Word of God, we have already been shown what the Word looks like, because He was made flesh and dwelt among us, ya know? And Jesus was interpreting the Scripture for us. "You've heard it said that you shouldn't kill, but I'm telling you and that even hating is the same thing," and so on.

Jesus wasn't afraid to "interpret" the
Scripture according to what was going on
around Him. So for instance, we're not
going to find any place where it says that
we can use computers, or fly in airplanes,
or wear bathing suits, but we do our best
to understand the spirit of the Scripture so
that when we do those things, we do them
in a way that we feel can best honor God
in our behavior. When Jesus said that a
'man will leave his father and mother and

cleave to his wife', Jesus was quoting Genesis. And we know that for thousands of years everyone who read that Scripture in Genesis did NOT take it to mean that one man should marry one woman. King David didn't think so. If we had a great leader in this day and age who cheated the way David did with Bathsheba, we might say we'd forgive him because he admitted he was wrong. But what about when David was old and all his people went looking for a young woman to get in bed with him and "keep him warm." I mean, we'd totally say he was a pervert. Acceptable sexual behavior has changed dramatically over the centuries. So we have to look at the spirit of the Scripture. We clearly shouldn't cheat on or lie to someone we love, for instance. I don't know where you live, but I would find a church where you can be all of who you are and start building a foundation, because your world really is going to rock. I have to say, though, that in the end living and walking in the Light is a much more joyous road than you can even guess from where you are."
