Thank you for bearing with me while I was traveling and then caring for my daughter. She is back on her feet and already back at her work as a counselor part time. She and I both appreciated your prayers and it was fun to spend some time with my son-in-law and grandkids, too.

You know I was in Denver (in JANUARY) for the meeting with the Union Seminary group of Evangelical gay-affirming Christians. Denver. Just sayin' it is nothing like January in Florida or California. But I am so glad I was there. The Union group (UAC) did some great work and visited with government officials and Christian leaders in the area. I stayed after our last meeting to attend the women's conference part of the GCN convention. Wow.

SO, among the people there were Nadia Bolz-Weber and Bishop Karen Oliveto and her wife, Robin Ridenour. I was awestruck. If you don't know Nadia, you need to YouTube her or read one of her books. She cannot be described. But, about Bishop Oliveto; let me give you some back story.

The United Methodist Church (UMC) is the largest mainline denominational church in the US – second only to the Baptists who for some reason are not called “mainline.” (It's in Wikipedia so it must be right.) Many years ago the UMC General Conference added wording to their Book of Discipline that affirmed that all people regardless of...(you know the list) are of sacred worth...and they will “not reject or condemn lesbian and gay members and friends.” But apparently immediately after that some people thought that extended the grace of Christ too far, so at the end of this lovely inclusion, they put in, “The practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching. Therefore self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in The United Methodist Church...”

At the last General Conference of the UMC in 2016 some people tried to get the denomination to turn that last part around, but amid a lot of heated words they finally decided to appoint a commission of leaders in the UMC to find a way to deal with this “issue” (or these human beings of sacred worth, you know). It is called The Commission

on a Way Forward and they are set to make their recommendation/s for the denomination in February of 2019.

In the meantime, the Western Region of the UMC, which includes the Pacific Northwest, northern California, Alaska, Hawaii and a few other states, elected a new Bishop last year, Rev. Karen Oliveto who is married to a woman. A lot of people outside that Region disagreed with the decision to make her a Bishop. I told my own pastor that once in a while it is just TIME to overturn the moneychangers tables and perhaps they felt it was time. He disagrees. The College of Bishops, however, found that they could not prove she was a “self avowed” homosexual, so they let her stay on, but they said that going forward, if you were married to someone of the same gender they were going to “interpret” that as being “a self-avowed, practicing homosexual.” SO they let her through the loophole, and then closed it behind her.

When I met her it was on a short break at the conference and I rushed up and said, “OK, I'm just a sycophant who had to shake your hand.” She took my hand then looked at the name tag around my neck and said, “I know who you are! You're my shero. I grew up singing your songs and you came out when no one would.” I wanted to jump up and down like a 5 year old I was so happy 😊. But she said it was NOT a turning over the moneychangers table decision. She said, “The Holy Spirit just fell on us. It was overwhelming and powerful.”

So Balm Ministries is partnering with RMN (Reconciling Ministries Network), the group committed to bringing the inclusion of people of all sexual orientations and gender identities in both the policy and practices of the United Methodist Church (UMC). We will be meeting at least once a month, in person or by tele-conference, to prepare the Tennessee Region of the UMC for the report from the Methodist Commission on a Way Forward. So far two of the 20 clergy at the 8000 member UMC we belong to in Brentwood TN have joined the group, although this giant church is not a “reconciling congregation”. (Is there anyone besides me who finds all these euphemisms for “letting queers be fully part of the Christian church” awkward? Why don't they just say what they mean?) ANYway, please pray for us. The UMC worldwide has well over 12 million members so this will be a big decision for a church that has so far said that gay clergy and gay marriage would not be accepted.

In the meantime, come to a concert or event listed on the other side or better yet, invite us to yours!
